

But you don't know the half of it.

Yet.

f you overheard a man's voice say, "My girlfriend's elephant is too old to breed," your ears would perk up, your left eye would squint in disbelief, and, while turning your head to see who it was, you'd ask yourself, "Did I hear that right?"


When you did, you'd find a man in a red silk shirt smiling back at you, continuing with the words, "The U.S. elephant gene pools are in trouble because it's illegal to

Who's there?

Reality Check.

Yes, this was a real conversation.

The man speaking was Blake Wallenda.


Chances are, you haven't met anyone in the world like Blake. Hearing him talk only takes seconds to recognize that his conversation topics aren't the only extraordinary thing about him.


You see, Blake grew up in a world straight out of children's stories. In that world, he developed a rare skill.

Blake's a Highwire Walker.

Blake is the great-grandson of Karl Wallenda – a skywalker known for performing dangerous feats and breaking world records. The legacy of the Wallendas goes back over 300 years. Blake carries on the bold tradition of his family despite Karl dying when he fell from a highwire, other Wallendas dying or becoming crippled for life, and himself nearly dying when he fell in 2017 from a human highwire pyramid but was able to stop himself by grabbing and holding onto the wire. On Aug. 10, Blake's about to attempt something so uniquely dangerous with Wall of Death motorcycle daredevil Kyle Ives at the Sturgis Buffalo Chip that you'll have to see it to grasp the magnitude of the feat taking place.

It's a story, unlike any story in

the history of time. A real oncein-a-lifetime tongue wagger, "Whoahhhhhh" maker, and eye popper because what Blake and Kyle are about to do has never been done and never will be again. Only one thing is predictable. If you're there, it's a tale you'll tell for the rest of your life.

The additional surprise is that Blake Wallenda and Kyle Ives aren't where this story begins.

It starts with a man named Shawn Ives. A throat cancer survivor. And Kyle's father. Shawn was mentored by Karl Wallenda and went on to walk highwire. He later became a motorcycle daredevil and now owns the rare Wall of Death daredevil exhibition, which he runs with Kyle and his other son, Cody.

Shawn's life took a twist a few days before the 2020 Sturgis Motorcycle Rally when he felt a lump in his neck while setting up the Wall of Death

at the Sturgis Buffalo Chip. It was

He spent the following year battling the disease and won, but if you ask Shawn about his fight against cancer, he chokes up and forces out the words, "It's like having the worst hangover you've ever had, every day, for a year."

He will also tell you, "When you go through something like cancer, you need someone beside you, rooting for you. I'm grateful for my wife. And proud of my sons."

In addition to working with the Wallendas, Shawn's family

had bonded with the Knievel family over the years. Kyle and Cody learned to ride and jump motorcycles at an early age. According to Shawn, one day, Evel Knievel was sitting on the back of their truck bed, watching the

two Ives kids jump their motorcycles, when Shawn leaned into Evel and said, "I hope that someday my kids will be as good as you."

Evel responded, "From what I can see, they're already better."

In 2022, Evel's son Robbie Knievel died of pancreatic cancer. Robbie had jumped at the Buffalo Chip many

> times over the years, including over its main stage and in its amphitheater.

When Robbie passed away, Shawn had an idea that would bring all of the elements of his life together full circle: Knievel, a tribute to Robbie, his

time with the Wallendas, his family legacy, the Buffalo Chip, and cancer fundraising.

Shawn dreamt up the idea that he would face death again. This time by choice.



Shawn approached Woody, the CEO of The Chip, "I want to do a jump at the Sturgis Buffalo Chip to raise funds for cancer and pay homage to Robbie."

Rod and Shawn concocted a plan and agreed that a run-of-the-mill ramp-to-ramp jump wouldn't suffice.

They would "need to do something truly spectacular."

A little research revealed that on October 20, 1973, Evel Knievel cleared 13 cars with a broken upper back while Karl Wallenda wirewalked overhead.

This inspired Shawn to invite Blake Wallenda to high-wire walk over the Chip's amphitheater before the Def Leppard concert.

Still, to be spectacular and push this death-defying legacy to a new level, "Someone should jump over Blake."

Like any good father would, Shawn volunteered his son, Kyle!

Both Kyle and Blake embraced the challenge. The stakes were high, but the jump was on. They aimed to accomplish a life-threatening performance even history's greatest daredevils hadn't dared before.

They would risk their lives attempting The Death Wire Daredevil Spectacular!


To spice up the show, Shawn announced he would also do a 10-car jump on an HD XG-750 street bike.

The Pediatric Brain Tumor Foundation agreed to create a Ride For Kids to the Chip fundraiser to allow riders to raise money on their journey to Sturgis to see the performance.

It's not hard to imagine what will happen if they fail. However, the glory of success is unparalleled if they make it.

No one, especially no true biker, should want to miss this incredible event.

"Thinking back on the moments in my life and knowing that they are



all wrapped up in this one event is unbelievable to me." reflects Shawn, "What we are doing makes me incredibly proud."

Kyle and Blake are not tempting death just for thrills and glory. Their act carries meaning. They're risking death while so many fight to avoid it to remind us all that life eventually comes full circle.

Cancer may have taken Robbie, and it once held Shawn by the throat, but their extraordinary performance symbolizes their love for a life worth fighting for. The circle will complete when Motorcycle Daredevil Kyle Ives Jumps over Blake Wallenda at The Death Wire Daredevil Spectacular on Aug. 10 at the Legendary Buffalo Chip.



The reality is to commit to spicing up your life, it needs to satisfy a deep curiosity, be part of something authentic, and make you feel more alive.


Getting out the door shouldn't be that hard, but sometimes it is.



aybe she just felt like running, but going the extra mile for our fallen heroes is something you can count on former 2020 Sturgis Buffalo Chip Poster Model Mai Richards running for.

This past May, during the Memorial Day holiday while most people were asleep, Mai laced up her combat boots at 6:00 a.m. sharp and set out to run 22 miles from Spearfish, SD to the Sturgis Buffalo Chip's Freedom Field, all while carrying the American flag and honoring fallen service members, stopping and reading their names throughout the run.

"What kept me motivated while preparing for this event was reminding myself that I want to live a life worthy of their sacrifices," said Richards. "I kept telling myself this during my training because running in combat boots this year was challenging. At some points during preparation and on the day of the event, I wanted to sit down and cry, but then my pain is nothing compared to what these heroes gave for all of us."

Richards used her social media platforms to promote the run, asking her community to submit names of their fallen heroes and to spread the word. Her call to action worked, and over 50 service members' names were submitted from people who wanted their fallen loved ones remembered.


The purpose of her run was to honor fallen military, who have died while serving in the United States Armed Forces, and to raise money for the annual Freedom Celebration held at the Buffalo Chip during the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally. The


Freedom Celebration dedicates a full day of patriotic events that honor our brave military. This year's Freedom Celebration is on Thursday, Aug. 10.



wasn't a good way for women riders to communicate with or meet each other, and women's riding groups

were few and far between. Participating in motorcycling as a woman came with more challenges and it was hard to find other women who had had similar experiences to build friendships.

Then, fifteen years ago, Motorcycle Hall of Famers Gloria Struck, Cris Sommer Simmons, and Laura Klock, along with ride expert Meg McDonough came together with the vision

of a charity ride and a desire to

elevate the interest and support of women in motorcycling. They saw an opportunity to bring women

together with a similar interest and create a safe, supportive, and uplifting environment for all types of riders. The Sturgis Buffalo Chip shared this vision and became the home for Biker Belles Women's Day each year during the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally and, as of 2022, at Daytona

Bike Week for The Morning Ride with Harley-Davidson.

Since the inaugural charity ride in 2010, Biker Belles has implemented

many additions including a silent auction, a symposium, a Coffee Clutch, the Team Diva Comfort Zone, and a women's bike show presented by Maiden Moto. The expansion brought in many influential women and groups like Biker Belles Ambassador Diva Amy Skaling, Ride Safety Captain Vicki Roberts-Sanfilipo and Kelly Yazdi of Ride Wild who brought the Wild Gypsy Tour women into the circle. Today, over 100 guests participate in the annual event, and all of those who support females in motorcycling (both women and men) have been welcome to join.

In the past 15 years, dozens of the

biggest names in motorcycling have been special guests and symposium speakers including Jodi Perewitz, Maggie Hicks, Karen Davidson, Shelly Rossmeyer-Pepe, Jessi Combs, and many more, each providing their expertise, experience, mentorship, and support.

As a charity event, Biker Belles raises funds each year for worthy local and national charities, like Laura Klock's Helping with Horsepower and the Jessi Combs Foundation, and has donated over \$150,000 to date.

What began as a small morning ride from The Lodge at Deadwood to the Buffalo Chip has become a highly anticipated gathering of supportive, influential, and passionate women who uplift and encourage each other in all facets of life and lead the way for up-and-comers to find mentors and a home for women riders. 



or well-known people like Robbie Knievel, so much of the story is known or assumed that a regurgitation of facts is seldom necessary. If you're reading this, you know that the daredevil son of a daredevil father followed in his

father's tire tracks to achieve his own notoriety. He experienced similar hazards of the job, including too many injuries and the consequences of pain management, ultimately leaving far too young.

But sketched outlines of someone's life give little insight into the real person, the human beyond the spotlight. So, in advance of the Death Wire Daredevil Spectacular honoring Robbie, we reached out to friends and family, for a more complete and nuanced view of a man many recognized but few actually knew.

One who knew Robbie Knievel is Bill Rundle, Robbie's crew chief and a lifelong friend from their hometown of Butte, MT. Bill described Robbie as the little brother he never had





and remembers 10-year-old Robbie throwing rocks at his shop windows to get attention. Soon Robbie was hanging out at Bill's shop and going racing with Bill and the older guys. "Robbie was just an all-around, natural talent," said Bill. "At a young age he stuck with us - and we rode hard."

Bill said Robbie watched his father and knew what he wanted to do from an early age, but he and Evel bumped heads a lot. "He listened to his dad but there came a time he wanted to do it on his own. He was kind of a loner. I'd see him start biting his nails, and I could tell he was thinking about something."

Many who worked with Robbie

or followed his career ultimately became his friends. Gary Spellman was instrumental in Robbie's career when Paul Mitchell Systems became an important sponsor in the early 2000s. Gary and JP DeJoria, owner of Paul Mitchell, had met Robbie at the Buffalo Chip through Chip owner Rod Woodruff and Marjoe Gortner. Talking about Robbie now, Gary recalls a personal story.

"When I think of Robbie, the biggest standout is how he kept in touch when my son was born. Dakota was a preemie and Robbie drove his RV from Albuquerque to Austin to be with us. He was the first person besides me and my wife to hold Dakota. I didn't think we'd ever get

the smell of cigarette smoke off him!"

But, Gary said, it wasn't always smooth sailing on the business side. "Sometimes you wanted to kill the guy when he was irresponsible. He'd say, 'I'm not afraid of Jack Daniels... I jump over canyons!' But some of the girls he dated were way more dangerous than his motorcycles!"

Added Gary: "He was like a bullfrog with a hand grenade: you knew it was gonna explode but you never knew how messy it was gonna be. But he was kindhearted. I think of all the times I watched him give so much of himself and how people took advantage of him."

Brian Hendricks might be described as a fan who became a friend of Robbie's. "I grew up watching Evel on TV and noticed Robbie, who was more my age," said Brian. "I saw him do the Caesar's jump (1989) and was at Atco in New Jersey (1991) when he crashed. That's when I first met him."

Brian would often wait by the RV after the show to say hello. One night, Robbie wrote down his phone number for Brian, adding, "Call me whenever you want to come see me jump."

"I was on cloud 9," said Brian, who ultimately attended over 30 of Robbie's jumps. "Robbie was always good to me."

As special as Robbie made Brian feel, that wasn't unusual. Warren

Croyle, Robbie's manager and close friend said, "You've never seen bigger smiles on the faces of the veterans or the many challenged or under privileged children Robbie spent time with. He loved giving back and always referred to our veterans as the 'true heroes'." And in spite of the near-constant pain, Warren said Robbie never let it get in the way of making a positive impact on anyone he came across who needed a boost or a kind word.

Lathan McKay, a producer, historian, entrepreneur and cofounder of the Evel Knievel Museum, came to know the Knievel family and Robbie well. Lathan remembers Robbie with empathy. "Every daredevil in modern times chased Evel. Imagine being the

number one fan and the son of Evel Knievel! Try putting yourself in those shoes," he said.

"Evel and Robbie were both the best. Period. Robbie's legacy is now cemented, and it's time for him to be celebrated."

Even – or especially – with celebrities, family knows them best. Said Robbie's daughter, Krysten Knievel, "He was the toughest, most badass guy when it came to jumping and hurting himself and going through the healing. But when it came to his emotional side, his family, telling me how he felt – he was so kindhearted. He had a rough, tough exterior but he was a softhearted person."

He had a contemplative side, too, and retreated to nature. "We bonded spending time in the outdoors, camping, hiking and fishing." said Krysten. "When I was little, he scared the crap out of me over bigfoot!" she laughed.

She also describes Robbie as a dog whisperer, resulting from the gentleness she says he got from his mother, Linda. And though he was a showman, ("In that kind of career you have to have some ego.") she says he treated everyone equally. "He always told me growing up: Be humble. Treat the janitor the way you treat the CEO."

Krysten endured nasty comments from people when the news broke of Robbie's death. "Clearly his illness had its complications, but we're all flawed. Please don't give people any more fuel to judge him."

Unlike Evel, whose x-rays show pins and plates, Robbie had only one piece of metal in his body; a metal spine that became necessary after he chipped vertebrae over a decade ago. Fortunately, he landed his three jumps at the Buffalo Chip successfully. Recalled Chip owner Rod Woodruff, "I remember referring to Robbie as a daredevil and he said, 'Woody, I'm not a daredevil. I'm a professional daredevil!"

As for the Death Wire Daredevil Spectacular happening at the Chip on Thursday, Aug. 10, said Woody, "The people doing this were fans of










Robbie's, and the idea to produce a remarkable jump in his memory came about just after Robbie passed, when we were reminiscing about his jump through the stage in 2000. If Robbie were here, he'd probably have wanted to do this jump."

But his daredevil legacy lives on. Said Krysten, "When I look at him as a whole, deep down, he was a kind, emotional person who loved his family." Added Bill: I've never known anyone as kind. We know the other parts, and that's just how he was."

That word, kind, kept coming up when people talked about Robbie Knievel. All said, it's not a bad legacy, even as it blends with the wilder stories that made knowing Robbie such a distinct and complex experience. That's also what made him unforgettable.

is that, really? If you want to do your thing just start by getting your friends together and doing your thing. Don't

worry about who's soiling their pants from flexing too hard down the street. So, that's exactly what The Chip did... they soiled their pants with dirt instead.








Motorcycle Influencers

Influencers. Wow. Might as well open this article with the F word.

o some, "influencer" is a four-letter word with negative connotations. You say influencer and someone's mind might jump to a self-obsessed, pseudo celebrity peddling a face cream they've never once tried and making a million bucks to post about it.

Must be nice.

But in certain scenes, the motorcycle industry especially, influencers look and act a little differently. Motorcycle "influencers" create entertaining, informational, and most importantly, authentic content, and because of that, the term we'll use is

"content creator".

So, what the heck is a content creator anyway?

A content creator produces written, audio, or visual information for digital content marketing or entertainment platforms, like social media, YouTube, podcasts or blogs. Basically, content creators publish content digitally on social networks or video sharing sites.
